The Basic General Geology Class taught by Richard L. Bartels, concluded with a field trip to Taylors Falls and vicinity.

This fall Dr. Gerald Webers will be offering a companion class in Historical Geology at Macalester College.

Taylor Falls

TAYLOR FALLS - FIELD TRIP REPORT

Leader - Prof. Bartel

The class met at Taylor Falls at 9:AM Here we looked at the large basalt flows and the famous pot holes. Bart said there were ten separate flows in the area. The basalt was stained red and green, the first due to iron stains and the latter due to copper salts. Coglomerates above the basalt are sedimentary rocks carried in by glaciers from northern Minnesota one-malf billion years ago.

The next stop was Franconia, Minn. for a look at Franconia Sandstone. This 65 ft. thick formation was named after the town. Above the sandstone is a very red colored till.

At Marine we saw a pot hole of the same type found at Taylor Falls. In this area, shale is found between the sandstone layers which contains worm trails. Also found in this area are cross bedded layers of sandstone.


