Geology of Minnesota

The diversified scenery of Minnesota - of which the Rochester area is one phase is due to the location of the state in the approximate center of the continent, Situated midway between the Atlantic and Pecific oceans, Mudaon Bay and the Gulf of Mexico, the state has within its boundaries three principal divides in the waternheds of North Aserica. Minnesota lacks the rugged topography and high elevations found in most continental divides. Its highest elevation 2500 feet on the Mesalf Range is in close proximity to its lowest, the surface of Lake Superior, 502 feet above the sea.

The central surface of the state slopes from the North-Central portion near Itasca Park in four directions toward its distant and opposite corners.

The 10,000 lakes of Minnesota cover 5,800 square miles, an average of 1 square mile of water for every 15 of land. This unprecedented supply of water which has a surface exceeding the water are of any other etate, finds the way to the ocean through Hudson Ray, the reat lakes and the Gulf of Mexico.

#### TABLET INSCRIPTION #17

Geology of Minnesota

#### WHITEWATER STATE PARK

The bold and picturesque bluffs of the Whitewater Valley from the Jordan Sandaton below to the assessive Omeota Dolonite at the top, represent deposition during a hundred million years. Much of the erosion of these marine sedimentary rocks occurred later during the great ice ages caused by nellwater from the glaciers descending rapidly from the highlends into the flooded valley of the Mississippl River.

During the glacial highwater stages in the Mississippi Valley, the velocity of the water in the Whitewater valley was retarded. In consequence the sediments brought to the Whitewater fiver by its tributaries could not be carried any farther and were deposited on the valley floor.

Later, as the water level in the Mississippi Valley was lowered, the Whitewater River gained velocity and eroded downward into the accumulated sediments to the level of its present channel, leaving high on the valley walls alluvial terraces of sand and gravel to mark its elevation when the Whitewater river stood at a higher level.



For those wishing to spend a few extra days in the Baraboo area we have listed additional places of interest:

CIRCUS WORLD MUSEUM - 3/4 mile S.E. on State 113 at 426 Water St. recreates the history of the circus.

PARFREY'S GLEN - 8 mi S.E. on State 11 is a deeply recessed wooded canyon reserved for botanical research.

DEVIL'S LAKE STATE PARK - 3 mi. So. of Baraboo on State 123. Devil's Lake, spring bed and having no vimible outlet, is enclosed on three sides by the quartzite cliffs of the Baraboo Range.



THE HOUSE ON THE ROCK - 7 mi So. of Spring Green on State 23 (see map) is a multilevel home standing atop a chimneylike rock.
