 GSM had an outstanding lecture series covering chemical foundations in earth geology, chemistry of minerals, and the evolution of the earth's crust. Igneous activity, metamorphic and sedimentary processes were also analyzed.

Dr. Gerald Webers, Macalester College led two lab sessions on fossil identification.

 Spring Banquet was held at Duff's Smorgasbord, Ward's Terrace Shopping Center, Robbinsdale. Guest speaker was Dr. Daryl R. Karns, General College, U of M.
