

ADVANCE NOTICE -- FIELD TRIP FOR AUGUST - 1988

The GSM will offer, as one of its summer, 1988, field trips, a two-week excursion to southern Wyosing and northeastern Utah. The trip will examine the nocks, structures, geologic history, and landforms of the Southern Rocky Mountain Provice (Medicine Bow Mountains), the Central Rocky Mountain Province (Unita Mountains/Dinosaur National Monument/ Flaming Gorge National Recreation Area), and the Wyoming Overthruss Belt (including Possil Butte National Moument). The trip will be episodic, in that members may enter on leave the field trip whenever they wish; thus, a commitment for two full weeks is not required.

Transportation is by private automobile. Participants may either camp or stay in motels. He will remain in selected areas for two to four days each, then move on. An optional pretrip meeting will be held sometime next spring for interested members. A complete itinerary will be available soon.

The dates for the field trip are Saturday, July 30, 1988 through Sunday, August 14, 1988. The trip itself will begin on Monday, August 1, mass Lamasie in Sundays Renern Hyoming and end on Thursday, August 11, near Reemerer in southwestern Hyoming. Field trip leaders will be GSM members Mary Kimball and Dick Uthe.
