A SPECIAL BUSINESS MEETING is called by the loard of Directors of the Geological Society of Minnesota at the Spring Banquet to vote on a resolution pertaining to the change in dues structure which will amend the by-laws of the GSM . The Board feels that the minimal increase of \$5.00 per year for couples and individuals and \$2.00 for students is appropriate at this time, and will allow the Society to operate on balanced budget for the coming years. Adollar amounts for membership have only been raised one since the Society began in 1936 and that was in the fall of 1981.



The following resolution is proposed:

Amend Article 2 to read as follows:


